

Three questions you should ask Barack Obama today when he visits B'nai Torah Congregation in Boca Raton.

1. In an interview, you called for a summit of Muslim nations, including Iran and Syria, but excluding Israel. **Why?** (Reuters, 1/30/08)
2. One of your top advisors, Tony McPeak, placed blame on Miami and NY Jews for the failure of the Middle East peace process, yet he remains in this role. **Why?** (The Oregonian, 3/27/03)
3. You were a board member of a foundation that funded, during your tenure, the Arab American Action Network, a pro-Palestinian organization. **Why?** (LA Times, 4/10/08)



It is no surprise that Barack Obama is visiting a synagogue in Florida today. Because of Barack Obama's lack of experience and dangerously naïve foreign policy thinking, many Americans have real concerns.

Obama's willingness to meet unconditionally with enemies such as President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad of Iran, his surrounding himself with troubling policy advisors like Tony McPeak and Zbigniew Brzezinski and his 20-year membership in a church led by anti-Israel, anti-American Reverend Jeremiah Wright have raised real doubts about his judgment.

Obama even said, "Nobody is suffering more than the Palestinian people." (The Miami Herald, 3/12/08) It's an outrage.

But not only should Obama answer questions about these issues, he needs to explain why he supports pro-Palestinian, pro-Arab policies such as holding a summit of Muslim nations that would exclude Israel and include countries such as Iran and Syria.

And Obama should answer why he was on a board of a charitable foundation, the Woods Foundation, which generously supported a pro-Palestinian, anti-Israel organization.

We need some answers. Because...

Barack Obama's dangerously naïve policies and lack of experience raise real concerns for all Americans, especially those who care about Israel and the future of the Jewish people.
